

Everybody appeared to have a trouble-free day and at this particular point in time we are still waiting for the results to be ratified, as such I can't report who was fastest on the day. The next round of the CSCA will be held at Pheasant Wood on the 25th of June with the TSOA round to follow on the 16th of July. In advance, we will be looking for a few volunteers to help out on the day, so please put the date in the diary and any help will be appreciated.

In talking to a number of people on the day there appears to be a need to organise a training day or development day for a number of new competitors to introduce them to motorsport. While this sounds like a great idea the cost in hiring a track would make this unfeasible. However, there is an opportunity to tag on to one of the many open track days that Wakefield have and to use one of these days to get a group of drivers, experienced and unexperienced, to come out and have a bit of fun and get to know their cars a bit better, with the hope of progressing to super sprints or something more serious in motorsport.

Briefly the Wakefield track day are on average run 1-2 times a month, the cost is \$190 for the day, if you do not have a license, a day license can be purchased from Wakefield. You can use any car you want. The drivers are divided into 4 or 5 groups depending on skill and ability. All that is required is neck to toe clothing and a helmet, you do not need a race harness or any other specialist equipment. This is a relatively easy way to get out on the track and to experience what it is like to drive your car at speed without worrying about speed traps or head on traffic.

On a good day you will get a good 4-6 sessions which I would suggest will be more than enough to satisfy your need for speed. Wakefield email me dates as they become available, if anyone is interested, please let me know and I will try to organise a day out at the track. Please keep in mind most of these days are held mid-week. I believe SMSP also hold track days but having been to a few of these I believe the Wakefield Park track days are better value for money.

SUPERSPRINTS ROUND 2 SMP Amaroo (South) Circuit April 23 hosted by Sprite Car Club of Australia

We spent the entire week beforehand scrutinizing the BOM forecasts, frequently glancing up at the sky and dodging the all too frequent showers. The forecast heavy rain did not quite eventuate, but Sydney was far from dry. The heavy rain at my place overnight on the Friday had me pretty nervous. **It's a long way from** Cronulla to SMP and I can manage only **1 set of tyres** ... but which one?

Saturday morning dawned dry (well not actively raining) so it was a case of suck it up, take a punt and off we go. When I did arrive at SMP South Circuit the few competitors there already were picking their way gingerly to the apparently dryer spots between the shallow puddles of rainwater in the carpark. Luckily *Team Triumph* member Ian Mash had secured a good area up against the fence early. Ian and I proceeded then to spread ourselves out quite a bit and for long enough to hold sufficient dry ground for the rest of *Team Triumph* members as they trickled in and spread out.

Team Triumph racing this day included John Whittaker Spitfire, Geoff Byrne TR6, Lindsay Day 2.5Pl, Ian Mash MX5, Thomas Derwent TR7, Trent Avery Evo7, Phillip Larmour Dolomite Sprint, John Stokes in his Stag and your Editor in my TR6. A very respectable TSOA turn out. In marque terms Triumph was probably only outnumbered by Club Lotus (as usual). However, by adding in the large number of shiny *Team Triumphs* to be found at the other end of the pit carpark, there to enjoy the club lunch, we easily outnumbered all other marques on the day.

The supersprinting for the day was highly rewarding for those of us who managed to get out there. A very grippy and surprisingly dry track (after initial drying off) and a very smoothly run day - thank you Sprite Club - a free chicken lunch plus a lot of interesting conversations, and technical comparisons, to be had in the pits as TSOA members, old and new, swapped yarns. Times for the day were very good for most of our members with Trent Avery being the fastest TSOA driver for the day with a lap time of 1:06.6 A couple of *Team Triumph* entrants did perhaps not have their best days however it was interesting to see just how many willing helpers there were around when it came time to get under, over or push these reluctant runners. *Team Triumph* at the lunch tent also appeared to be having a good day (refer social reports).

The next CSCA Round 3 is on 25 June at Pheasant Wood Circuit hosted by MG Newcastle, we hope to see you there.

Supersprints and where they may
take you?Howard Glinn

Follow up on last month's article on lap dashes and where it may lead you

So the follow up from last month's article was last weekend's first round of the Formula Ford Sate Round at SMP. Having not been at a race track since December 2021, to turn up Friday to a track totally flooded and the rain continuing nearly all day was always going to be a challenge. Greg Morsillo made the long trek down to help get the set up sorted. Never fun to go out for 20 minutes at a time in very heavy rain with no roof, no windows and no aero to help push he car down on the track. Even worse when both your visor and glasses keep fogging up.



Changes for such a wet track were to remove 1 degree of the camber on each of the 4 wheels. The next was to add 2.5 Psi to each tyre as it goes out onto the track, then remove the sway bar settings front and rear, and soften the shocks off by 6 clicks on both the bounce and rebound on all 4 shocks. Normally we measure the tyre when it comes in at 3 places across the face but on a wet track **that doesn't work as the pooled water takes all** the temp out of the tyres. Each session when the car comes in Greg and Josh do a long debrief on any problem corners to try and dial out any oversteer/understeer. Given the many fast left hand corners we ended up with a different setup on the left to the right of the car. For the last session we had the understeer all fixed but then had to work on how the car responds from turn 4 to 5 (a fast right then straight into a fast left. The car unloads itself through the change in direction and it takes fine **tuning to get so that it doesn't unsettle in the transfer point. (Which can** easily lead to an induced spin). As we packed up for the day Greg and Josh had found a good wet set up.

Saturday was another wet day with just the qualifying and race one. Josh had a blinder of a start from 8th to be 3rd at turn 3 but was pushed out wide onto the grass so finished 6th. The cars are designed so that the corner (front and lower control arms) simply collapse and fold inwards in an accident and at over \$5K per corner to fix touching other cars is not a **good idea for a privateer's wallet!**

Sunday started to dry out. This meant increasing the font bar by 20 mm and the rear by 10 mm and then 4 click turns on the front shocks and 2 on the rear. Another great start by Josh but 2 spins in large puddles including a massive 360 in turn one resulted in a finish in 5th. The day kept drying out on track but looked very cloudy. We had to set the tyre pressure on the dummy grid, removed 5 mm of rear bar and 2 clicks more on the rear shocks as it was going to be dry. Josh was 5th at the end of lap one and had an 8 second gap to 2nd and 3rd. Lap by lap he slowly closed the gap. Always trying to keep to the drying line. With 2 laps to go he was in 3rd place and 2 secs behind 2nd. Slowly as the laps progressed he closed the gap to second. As he headed down the back straight before the last turn onto the main straight, he made the brave move to make a pass on



the right that started as he exited the fishhook. He had completed the pass on the outside but not quite enough to move left for the turn and to be back on the dry line. Wide and on the wet line he **simply couldn't make the stop cleanly** and so the other car regained 2nd through the turn on the dry line. Josh pulled in close behind and tried to get the slip stream down the last straight. He pulled wide and was only 0.2 secs behind across the line and would have been second if the finish line was only 50 meters further down the road. But that's motor racing.

We are incredibly proud that he got third place for the main race! So who knows? When you start doing lap dashes with TSOA it may take you somewhere similar to Josh in the years ahead

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

and so it was the following week, not sure what night, Tuesday I think, I found myself sitting in Norton St. Leichhardt with no other cars in sight. I waited a while and then decided I must have the wrong night; I was about to leave when an absolutely immaculate black TR4A pulled up behind me. Don Hunter, the driver of this



splendiferous machine introduced himself, and we chatted about cars in general and TR's in particular for a while. Don then proposed that as nothing was doing, he knew of an excellent hamburger joint on Parramatta Rd., and that we should adjourn to it. I came to discover that Don was quite the guru on excellent hamburger joints all over Sydney. We were just about to leave, when a Falcon Wagon pulled in behind us, and out jumped a member I came to know as John Parker, with his wife Carol. So we all entered the ARDC, and soon after, quite a few members rolled

in. It was at this time that I learned what "TSOA time" meant, anything up to half an hour after the posted starting time.

Noelene Harris was the first to pounce on me, wanting to know what I drove, and less importantly who I was. Amongst others she introduced me to husband Terry, and we all hit it off right away. Noelene and Terry, Shirley and myself became all but inseparable, right up to Noelene's



death, and then Terry's slide into dementia. But this first night was terrific. Met Neville Turbit, Editor, Graham Masters, Secretary, I think it was here I first met Geoff Byrne, Competition Secretary, and many others. Glaringly neither Don Trudgitt nor Bob Fulton were present.

There was an old upright piano in one corner near the billiard table where several members were playing snooker, not a game fit for gentlemen, but few of us were gents in those days. John Parker had sat himself down at it and was belting out "The Teddy Bears' Picnic" for all he was worth, whilst those of us that knew the lyrics sang along with gusto. Now I don't know if that was the only song John knew, or if the piano was really a pianola and that was the only roll available. Either way Teddy Bears' Picnic became the club song for years afterwards and was sung virtually wherever we went.

The following Tuesday night was the monthly club meeting, and the first to be held in the Leyland Auditorium on South Dowling Street. Zetland. This time Bob Fulton was there and we sat together whilst Bob pointed out some of the club luminaries, several of whom I had met the week before at the ARDC. There was Graeme Laurie on the stage, he was our new President, and the first to have a Spitfire not a TR. I pointed to a group of blokes who all seemed to be sitting slightly apart in a huddle of their own, and asked "well who are that lot over there?" Bob leaned over and whispered in hushed and reverential tones; "They are the Ecurie Triumph boys". "What are the Ecurie Triumph Boys when they're at home?" I asked. "They are the guys that race Triumph sports cars" Bob replied. "Well what about that old geezer in the middle of them, surely he's not racing?" I asked. Bob nearly fell backwards off his chair, "That's Bob Kennedy, one of the aces" Years later when I was at Bob's 80th, I did a calculation and worked out that Bob was probably about 40 when I made that comment! Bob and his wife Dot and I became good friends over the years, and if you ever wanted to know anything about hotting up a 3A for racing, well you didn't ask Bob, because he held onto all his secrets, but what a lovely man and a true gentleman.

At the end of the business session, Graeme politely asked the ladies if they would adjourn to the kitchen and prepare the coffee and biscuits, magnanimously supplied by Leyland, for the break. Imagine that today! I started to head for the kitchen for my coffee, when I was roughly pulled aside by one Alan Higginbotham, often known as Higginetcetera, but usually just plain Higgie. Anyway, this bearded chap said "Nah mate, you come with us. I was to discover that "us" was a group of desperates revving up their TR's waiting to do a Le Mans style start out of the Leyland carpark and into South Dowling Street. I tagged along, and discovered that tradition amongst this group, of which I suspect Terry Harris was the ringleader, was to race to the nearest pub, in this case the Bat And Ball at Cleveland Street, sink two schooners of beer, and then fang it back to the meeting in time for the second half which usually involved 16mm motor racing movies from B.P or Shell or Castrol and sometimes even Leyland, especially when Paddy Hopkirk was blitzing everybody in a works Cooper Mini. I decided right away that this club was definitely worthy of my membership fee, and signed up straight away, a decision I have never regretted even for one second in 52 years of membership.

So much for the preamble of getting the car, and joining the club, There is plenty more for me to bore you with when I regale you with the adventures and fun, and pure camaraderie I have experienced with this club. So don't leave the country, and for heaven's sake don't resign your membership.

THE SOCIAL SIDE

My first social outing with the club was an organised coach tour to Tyrrells Winery in the Hunter Valley. Shirley and I had recently become friends, and so this was her first encounter with the club. The coach was leaving from North Sydney, so as I was driving off the Harbour Bridge and into Pacific **Highway I saw Geoff Byrne's** concours winning TR5. He



called out and asked if we were going on the wine trip. I replied in the affirmative. "The coach is just up that street" he said, "introduce yourself when you get on board". The trip back to Sydney started off soberly enough, but our driver made a fundamental error when he decided it was a good idea to return via Broke, and then, silly man, decided it was also a good idea to make a stop at the Wollombi Inn, where we were introduced to "Dr, Jurd's Jungle Juice" Well after nearly everyone having bought at least a half flagon of the dreaded juice and then having consumed most of it on the journey home, I'll bet the poor old driver wished he had gone straight down the highway, because at least one of our number disgraced themselves down the back of the bus. Poor old Pykes Coach Tours I'll bet were never the same after.

Soon after this outing Shirley and I drove overnight to Adelaide in the TR3A. The Organisation: GIPPSLAND GALLOP 2022 Sunday 10th April



We start at Warragul Woolies with the <u>Breakfast Car Show</u> for early birds.-The Warragul Restorers Car Show occurs on every second Sunday morning of the month with an excellent collection of diverse machinery. Timing is informal – there are usually cars coming and going through this **time. I'll suggest that those wishing to have a look**, turn up between 8 and 9-ish then drive half a km to the start <u>at Warragul Supercheap carpark</u> – 9.00 for a 9.30 AM start – this is just off the freeway for those who are coming direct from Melbourne. There is coffee, snacks and toilets available (about 300 meters away). Then we leave at about 1-minute intervals for an observed **section run.... This will be in total about 20 questions between** Warragul and Mirboo North. It will not be a navigation run but simple observation and we will supply route maps. The first half will lead up north of the highway via Willow Glen to the Bryant Park Hillclimb.
